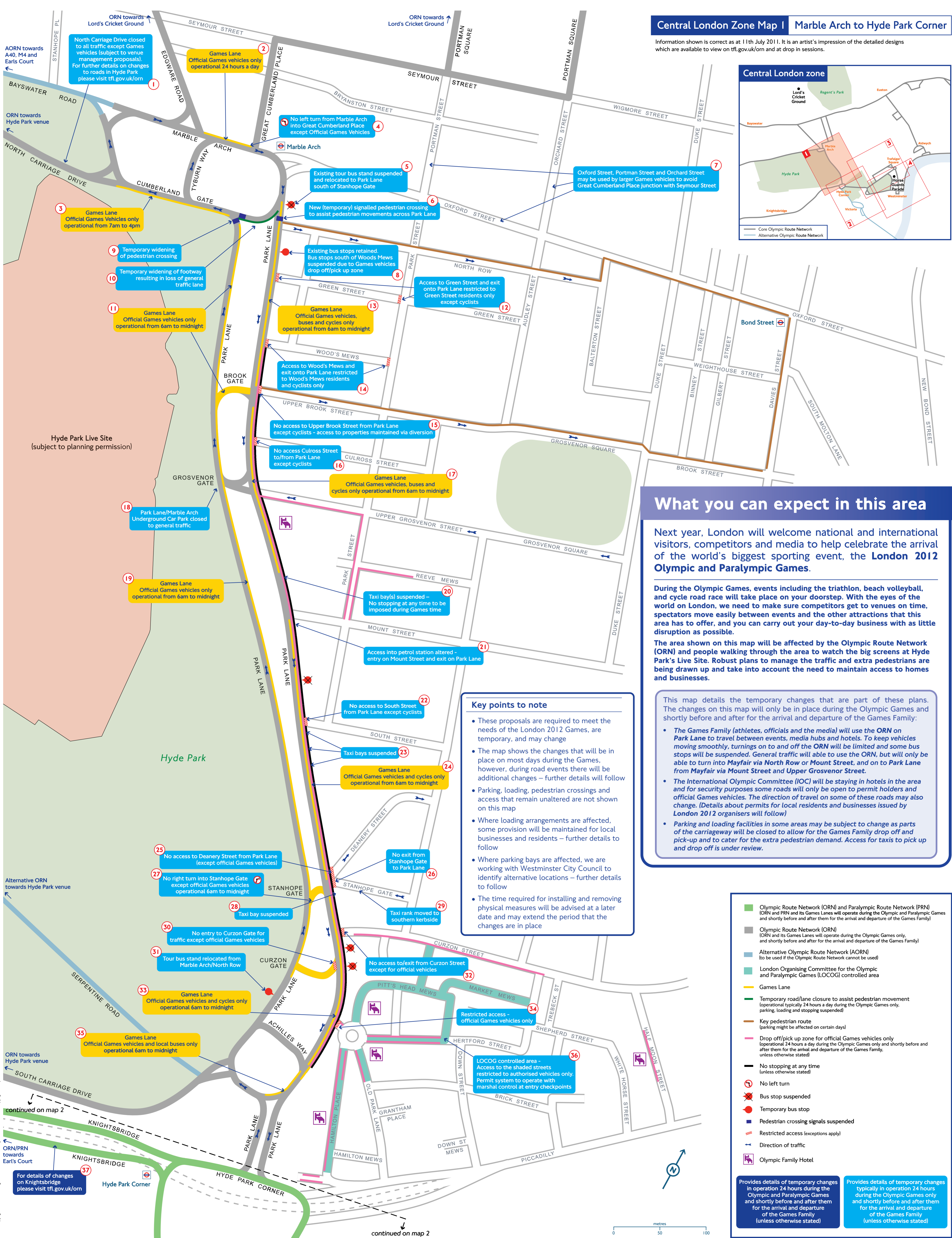
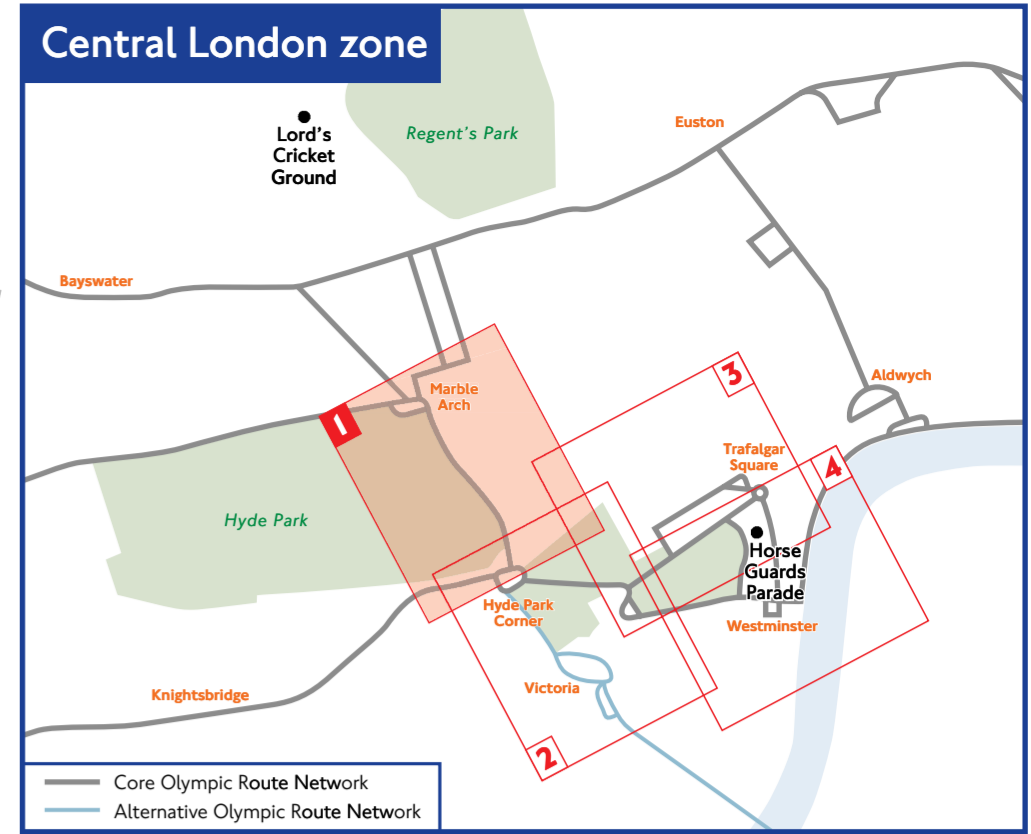

What you can expect in this area

Next year, London will welcome national and international visitors, competitors and media to help celebrate the arrival of the world's biggest sporting event, the **London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games**.

During the Olympic Games, events including the triathlon, beach volleyball, and cycle road race will take place on your doorstep. With the eyes of the world on London, we need to make sure competitors get to venues on time, spectators move easily between events and the other attractions that this area has to offer, and you can carry out your day-to-day business with as little disruption as possible.

The area shown on this map will be affected by the Olympic Route Network (ORN) and people walking through the area to watch the big screens at Hyde Park's Live Site. Robust plans to manage the traffic and extra pedestrians are being drawn up and take into account the need to maintain access to homes and businesses.

- This map details the temporary changes that are part of these plans. The changes on this map will only be in place during the Olympic Games and shortly before and after for the arrival and departure of the Games Family:
- The Games Family (athletes, officials and the media) will use the ORN on Park Lane to travel between events, media hubs and hotels. To keep vehicles moving smoothly, turnings on to and off the ORN will be limited and some bus stops will be suspended. General traffic will be able to use the ORN, but will only be able to turn into Mayfair via North Row or Mount Street, and on to Park Lane from Mayfair via Mount Street and Upper Grosvenor Street.
 - The International Olympic Committee (IOC) will be staying in hotels in the area and for security purposes some roads will only be open to permit holders and official Games vehicles. The direction of travel on some of these roads may also change. (Details about permits for local residents and businesses issued by London 2012 organisers will follow)
 - Parking and loading facilities in some areas may be subject to change as parts of the carriageway will be closed to allow for the Games Family drop off and pick-up and to cater for the extra pedestrian demand. Access for taxis to pick up and drop off is under review.

- #### Key points to note
- These proposals are required to meet the needs of the London 2012 Games, are temporary, and may change
 - The map shows the changes that will be in place on most days during the Games, however, during road events there will be additional changes – further details will follow
 - Parking, loading, pedestrian crossings and access that remain unaltered are not shown on this map
 - Where loading arrangements are affected, some provision will be maintained for local businesses and residents – further details to follow
 - Where parking bays are affected, we are working with Westminster City Council to identify alternative locations – further details to follow
 - The time required for installing and removing physical measures will be advised at a later date and may extend the period that the changes are in place

- Olympic Route Network (ORN) and Paralympic Route Network (PRN) (ORN and PRN and its Games Lanes will operate during the Olympic and Paralympic Games and shortly before and after them for the arrival and departure of the Games Family)
- Alternative Olympic Route Network (AORN) (to be used if the Olympic Route Network cannot be used)
- London Organising Committee for the Olympic and Paralympic Games (LOCOG) controlled area
- Games Lane
- Temporary road/lane closure to assist pedestrian movement (operational typically 24 hours a day during the Olympic Games only, parking, loading and stopping suspended)
- Key pedestrian route (parking might be affected on certain days)
- Drop off/pick up zone for official Games vehicles only (operational 24 hours a day during the Olympic Games only and shortly before and after them for the arrival and departure of the Games Family, unless otherwise stated)
- No stopping at any time (unless otherwise stated)
- No left turn
- Bus stop suspended
- Temporary bus stop
- Pedestrian crossing signals suspended
- Restricted access (exceptions apply)
- Direction of traffic
- Olympic Family Hotel
